CERTIFICATE SCHEDULE

The Spring 2025 Value Chain Management Certificate Program is organized into nine online content modules, each comprised of 2-6 hours of a combination of live, interactive group discussions and self-paced learning. The modules run weekly from April 1, 2025, to May 27, 2025, on the dates indicated below. Preparation material is posted to an online learning platform, Desire2Learn, for your review prior to each session. Live, interactive group discussions based on the material are then led by university faculty, typically between 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. Eastern Time (ET). Participants put their lessons to practice in a simulation module in Modules Seven and Eight. A closing session observes the implications of current trends for the future.
